For an entire week, established artists from the South West and around the UK come to teach a range of innovative and exciting courses. Traditional skills such as iron casting, stone carving and cob techniques are taught alongside digital photography, documentary filmmaking and spatial structures. Artists, makers and students travel from all over the country and abroad to participate in the workshops and engage in lively debate and creative exchange. 
Inspirational courses and tutors

Students get to work with the most amazing artist/teachers, many who live and practise in the Dartmoor area.

- Earth Art is taught by artists and cob specialists Abey Smallcombe (Jackie Abey and Jill Smallcombe) and potter Rupert Johnstone. Abey Smallcombe has completed major commissions for the Eden Project and the National Trust and will be teaching the sculptural possibilities of earth materials. Rupert is a local potter and teacher, and one half of RAMP (Roop & Al Make Pots).
- Digital Photography: well-known Dartmoor photographer Chris Chapman leads this 5-day course, taking students out into the wild Dartmoor landscape then back to his studio to learn to process and print their own images.
- Landscape Painting: painter Daniel Adams will lead a group of students through the process of painting from sketchbook to working with oils, using the Dartmoor landscape as inspiration.
- Stone Carving: David Brampton-Greene, also based on Dartmoor, has taught widely and run workshops at the Natural History Museum and Yorkshire Sculpture Park. He has had a long-term collaborative relationship with Peter Randall-Page, who will be a visiting

take place every night that include artists talks, music, film screenings and performance. High-profile artists such as Antony Gormley, Richard Wilson and David Mach have given talks in previous years.

One of our most popular evening events is 'Desert Island Images', Dartmoor Arts' own artistic take on Desert Island Discs, where a select panel of castaway artists present their top eight art works they would take to a desert island.
